## **INGLEWOOD POLICE CHIEF HONORED AT MUSEUM OF TOLERANCE**

Chief Jacqueline Seabrooks was honored last night during the gala grand opening of the Freedom's Sisters Exhibition at the Simon Wiesenthal Center, Museum of Tolerance.

On September 13, 2011, Chief Seabrooks was announced as one of the Southern California Freedom's Sisters. The ceremony was held in the Museum's main auditorium.

Freedom's Sisters is a traveling exhibition developed by the Smithsonian Institution, Ford Motor Company Fund, and the Cincinnati Museum Center to highlight the inspired lives of 20 African-American women who fought for civil rights including, Harriet Tubman, Rosa Parks, Mary McCleod Bethune, Dorothy Height, Coretta Scott King, Betty Shabazz, Myrlie Evers-Williams, and Sonia Sanchez. The exhibition has been in venues across the country over the past three years and has now opened at the Museum of Tolerance.

The exhibition honors local "Freedom's Sisters" in each region where it opens. Chief Seabrooks was honored in Southern California for her contributions to the community, leadership, and commitment to fair and unbiased law enforcement during her 27-year career.
