The City of Inglewood's Police Department is committed to enhancing the quality of life of its residents, business owners, and visitors. Because community safety is a shared civic responsibility, we value your importance to our ongoing public safety efforts.

As the Police Department extends its reach within this community, we are reaffirming existing relationships, developing new partnerships, and utilizing a variety of strategies to ensure we maximize our value to you.
