MAN STABBED ON MTA BUS

A 57-year-old Los Angeles man was stabbed on an MTA bus in Inglewood.

On Monday, October 10, 2011, at approximately 10:20 AM, Inglewood police officers were dispatched to Florence Avenue and Hillcrest Boulevard to investigate reports of a fight on the bus. The officers discovered a stabbing victim, Murray Brown of Los Angeles.

Brown apparently got on the bus at Florence Avenue and Crenshaw Boulevard. He was approached by two female passengers who were already on the bus when he boarded. The females initiated a heated argument with Brown, and one of them produced a large knife and stabbed Brown in the head and neck. They exited the bus at Florence Avenue and Hillcrest Boulevard, and they were last seen running north on Centinela Avenue from Florence. An area search for the two suspects was unsuccessful, and they remain at large.

The suspects are described as follows:

Suspect #1: Female black in her 30s, with a heavy build, bald, wearing a brown hooded sweatshirt. She also has a scar on her face. Suspect #1 was armed with a knife and committed the assault.

Suspect #2: Female Hispanic in her 30s, with a thin build, long black hair, wearing a black shirt and blue pants. No weapon seen.

Brown was taken to an area hospital and is listed in critical, but stable condition with multiple stab wounds to his head and neck.
